Message from Mrs How

Welcome back, I hope you all had a pleasant Easter and were able to spend some quality time with family and friends.

This week's Star is a shortened version. With the children only being back for three days teachers have been busy getting new topics underway and settling the children back into school. By next week they will have lots of news to share with you.

As I am sure you will be aware, the current position with Covid-19 is that people are advised to stay home and avoid contact with other people if they have either tested positive for Covid (with no requirement for regular testing this may only come from people taking "fit to fly" tests) or if they have symptoms of a respiratory infection. Please see the attached letter from the LA with additional information.

From a school point of view, we will continue with all the good practice already in place including ensuring occupied spaces are well ventilated to let fresh air in and that we encourage good hygiene practices such as hand washing and cleaning.

I would like to think that this will give us a more settled term with fewer staff

It is really important to let us know as soon as you are able to so we can ensure messages get to the class in good time for the end of the day. We appreciate that there are times (ie when stuck in traffic) when it isn't possible to let us know earlier, but we would ask you to help us help you and your child(ren) by advising us with an email either on the morning of the change, or the evening before.

Please also remember that if your child is being collected with another child to let us know; we've had a number of occasions when the office has had to make last-minute phone calls at the end of the day for this reason.

Parking outside schools!

We are sure most of you are all aware of the continuing issues regarding parking outside schools during drop off and pick up times.



Unsafe, inconsiderate and dangerous parking is an offence and an increasing problem throughout our county, causing chaos for local residents and ultimately putting the safety of our children and others at risk.

Please STOP and THINK before parking!!

Consider, am I being respectful? Am I parking illegally? Is my parking dangerous? We can all do our bit to reduce the issues of parking during school drop offs & collection times. For the safety of your child, their friends and the local community we kindly request that you all park safety, legally and considerately.

Remember:

- · DO NOT park on single or double yellow lines
- DO NOT double park
- DO NOT stop or park on the zig zag lines or pedestrian crossing
- DO NOT park on pavements, corners or junctions
- DO NOT obstruct footpaths or cycleway's
- Consider car sharing
- · Walk or cycle to school where appropriate
- And finally...DO NOT block the driveways of local residents.

Test and Trace

Living with COVID-19: advice for those aged 18 and under

Has your child or young person aged 18 or under tested positive, or do they feel unwell with COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms? If so, there are a few simple steps they can take to protect their family and community – especially those at highest risk of severe illness.

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If they feel unwell and have a high temperature, with COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms, they should:



Try to stay at home, avoid contact with others and follow the guidance on gov.uk





Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare until they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to return



Carry on attending as normal if they only have mild symptoms like a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough and otherwise feel well



If they have had a positive test for COVID-19, they should:



Try to stay at home, avoid contact with others for 3 days and follow the guidance on gov.uk



Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare during this time, where they can



Go back after 3 days, but only if they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to do so
