

## News from Starling Class (Reception)

Hello from Starling Class!

This week the children have been thinking all about comparing seaside holidays in the past to the present. We had a discussion about how buildings, clothing, activities and transport has changed over time. We shared their own experiences of beach and seaside holidays and visits and the children had lots of fond memories to share.

In PE this week the children were demonstrating strength and bravery on the Play structure and revisiting their Balance Bike skills from the Spring Term. For the next few weeks the children's PE sessions will be practicing their Balance bike skills and confidence and building up more points for their Houses.

In Maths this week we have revisited the teens numbers from 11 to 20 with the aid of Numberblocks. We have used part-whole models, number lines and tens frames with counters to demonstrate how to make those numbers. We also discussed how many tens and how many ones make those numbers, if they were odd or even numbers and if they know which double makes them.



In Phonics this week, we revisited our Phase 3 phonemes and we looked at the Harder To Read and Spell words (AKA tricky words) which tie in with the new Phonics scheme which we will be using from September (don't panic, there will be another fun filled Phonics workshop to inform you all in the Autumn Term). The children worked really hard in teams to identify the spoken word, matching the tricky words, identifying the tricky parts of the words and generally having fun with the words. These words have been sent home for your information this week, ask your child to have a practice at home over the next few weeks, choosing a few to revisit at a time.



Please remember to keep practicing the Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonemes at home. The children will find spelling and reading much easier and quicker if they are more confident with their phonemes, particularly the digraphs and trigraphs.


In Group sessions this week, the children have been using and applying their Phase 4 Phonics knowledge to sentence writing, answering Yes/ No questions, playing buried treasure games and reading sentences with those pesky Phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs in them.



Please remember that due to the changeable weather, children will need to bring in water bottles, sun hats, coats/rain jackets, jumpers and cardigans EVERY DAY. All children will also be required to wear sun cream as they spend most of their day outdoors!

Next week will be the turn of the Green Apples for Show and Tell.




## News from Peacock Class (Year 3)

From Bewilderwood to Ashwell.

This week's highlight was the walk to Ashwell.

In preparation for the walk and visit, we spent some time reminding ourselves about the facts we have gathered so far along our pathways through the past.

There is evidence of a settlement in Ashwell from as far back as the Iron Age. We know this as archaeologists have found evidence and artefacts in the form of postholes, pottery remains, metalwork, and evidence of fires from domestic and early manufacturing. We were able to talk knowledgeably about these and how they would have been used by the Celts and the impact they had on the development of farming and daily life.



Jumping to the Tudors, we were able to talk about how and why houses were built and what they looked like. We could remember what show offs the Tudors were, given the chance, about how wealthy they were. We also discussed how superstition about spirits influenced their beliefs and lives. We listed what evidence we expected to find in Ashwell about its Tudor past.

Another leap through time found us in the 1940's. We expected evidence of Ashwell life in this time to be more plentiful, there may even be people to talk to that were actually there! We wrote a considerable list of what could be stored in the museum about this period.

Following all of these discussions we came up with a list of questions to find out why people live in Ashwell today, what does it have to offer, why do people choose to settle there and why do people stay?

The walk itself went very well, the weather was kind and we had lots of fun, although we were sure the school had been moved further away while we were in Ashwell, as the walk back seemed very long and **much** brisker than the walk there!



While in Ashwell, we had a snack and play in the park, visited the museum, went in the church, had a walking tour of Ashwell, interviewed 'Ashlothians', had a picnic, enjoyed an ice cream and had a very enthusiastic paddle in the Springs, all before heading back to school for the end of the day. I cannot imagine why anyone didn't sleep well on Wednesday night.

Back in the classroom, we have started work on creating a leaflet about Ashwell today; we are doing this in small groups so that we can share out all the work. This will form the basis of our work until the end of the year (I can hardly believe I have just written that last sentence, I do not know how we have reached this point of the year so very soon, time flying and fun!!)



Please remember next Thursday is our coffee and cake morning, when you can come in and share the children's topic books from the year. If you would like coffee *and* cake, could I

please ask for cake donations, whilst I can manage to make coffee and tea, my skills do not stretch to cake making. The last cake I made was perfect for the rocks and soils in our soil layer trifle, earlier in the year, and even then, there were complaints!

## News from Swift Class (Year 4)

This week, in our maths lessons we have been looking at the properties of shape. This has included revising the names for different types of quadrilaterals (rectangle, square, trapezium and rhombus ) as well as the vocabulary needed to describe angles (right, acute, reflex and obtuse). If you can help your child find angles in different contexts as part of looking at real life objects, this will help embed this knowledge.

We have enjoyed making baked spring rolls (春卷) learning how we could safely chop the vegetables so that they were fine enough to make the filling. We also learnt how to peel garlic cloves quickly and easily – just like Jamie Oliver! Our filling included: courgettes, bean sprouts, soy sauce, carrots, peppers, garlic and ginger. Several children stated that they already knew that they did not like some of the ingredients, but we always encourage children to try things – even if they have not enjoyed it in the past. Once they had created their spring rolls they were much more open to trying things and found that many of them did actually like them.

In computing lessons, we have been creating formulae in spreadsheets to instantly give answers that will change in real time as the inputs were changed – some were delighted that the maths could be done so quickly! We have also been thinking about how some people may present ‘opinions’ as ‘facts’ and how someone can encounter persuasion or influence online through different types of advertising. This led on to discussing why it is important to develop critical thinking skills about what information may be encountered online.

It is lovely to be able to take part in events with other classes once again. Earlier in the week we enjoyed forming part of the audience for Year 2’s class assembly, which was all about their work linked with the sea. Next week we are hoping that we get to see Year 6 in their dress rehearsal for their end of year production.

In Topic lessons we have continued to learn about North America and we are trying to remember as many of the capital cities as we can. We used the chrome books to research a region in North America and we found out some fascinating facts.

On Thursday and Friday of this week, we were lucky enough to have the opportunity to visit Bassingbourn Village College for the Year 5 Experience Days. This is the first time these days have taken place for a number of years because of COVID so everyone was very excited. These days are an opportunity for the children to spend some time inside their local secondary school getting a feel for the environment, the lessons and the staff. We are really pleased to say that your children did you proud and behaved well throughout. On Thursday we had English, Art, French and P.E. lessons and the plan for Friday is to try our hand at some Maths and PSHE and then watch a show put on by the Village College students in the afternoon. As we walked around the College, lots of familiar faces from previous classes at Steeple greeted the children. This made them feel welcome and helped to calm the nerves of a few of us who were feeling a little anxious about the unknown.



Friday afternoon back at Steeple contained another exciting experience for Year 5 as ten members of the class took part in the Rocksteady concert. More details to follow about this in next week's Star.
