Girls Football Competition - Tuesday 6th May



On Tuesday 6th May a squad of Year 4, 5 and 6 girls represented the school in a football tournament organised by Cambridge United at the iconic Abbey Stadium off Newmarket Road in Cambridge. We were invited due to being part of the scheme of different sports clubs that Cambridge United offer to local schools. Cambridge United currently run after school clubs at Steeple on a Tuesday (Multi-sports) and a Wednesday (Girls' Football).

The girls set off from the school at 8.25 and arrived at the Abbey Stadium in good time for a 9.30 start. The girls were really lucky to visit a professional football club and to be invited to play on the same pitch that internationals

such as Grant Hanley, Shane Lavery, Sulley Kaikai, Krystian Bielik and Park Seung-ho played on just three days earlier.

The pitch was divided into 4 areas and the girls played seven, 10-minute, 6-a-side matches against other schools in the Cambridge United family. The girls played really well and came up against some tough opponents of schools comprised of mainly Year 6 girls. They did well to finish sixth overall. Well done to all involved and to the parents who dropped off and picked up the girls braving the rush hour Cambridge traffic. CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS

Acorn Class

You may have heard that we have had 13 special little visitors in Acorn Class. We were lucky enough to spend the day with some chicks. The children were fantastic at being calm around the chicks and wrote notes to remind other visitors to the classroom that they must be quiet and not touch the chicks without permission. They were very responsible chick babysitters!

We have continued our learning on King's and Queens this week by looking at King John and The Magna Carta. The children enjoyed role playing King John taxing the people of England using plastic gold coins and then counting how much money King John had to spend on his soldiers and ships.

In Phonics, we have been thinking about consonants and vowels when spelling CCCVC and CCVCC words. The children are now really good at using the spelling sequence of: say the word, stretch it out, robot arms, blend the sounds, count the sounds and then write down the sounds you hear. We have been really impressed with their work ethic!

In Maths, we have now learnt about all of the numbers up to and including 20 and are now beginning to use those numbers in our work when adding and subtracting. This week the children have been using 10 (and 20) frames to work out how many have been added or taken away.

In PE, we have been learning about sports that are in athletics. We have practised our jumping, running and throwing. You will have received a parentmail about balance ability. The children will be completing this balance bike course next half term on a Thursday afternoon in their usual PE slot.

Yew Class

In English, we have finished our unit of work based on the book 'Coming to England.' We wrote a diary recount text of one of the key parts of the story before looking at migration and war (based on Michael Rosen's 'On the Move 'poem book). Using this as inspiration we planned, wrote and edited a poem about the events of Christmas 1914 during the first year of World War One. We have now started work on our next book – Shakespeare's Macbeth.

This week, in Maths, we are zooming through some of the topics: decimals and percentages and perimeter and area and we are now drawing and interpreting line graphs as part of our topic on statistics.

A big thank you to all the parents that attended and helped with words, costumes etc. for our class assembly last Wednesday. The children were great and after I gave them a structure to what we should do, many of the ideas came from the children themselves. We tried to pick out some of the topics that we have been learning this year so far and cemented it altogether with the German that we have learnt. The topics ranged from prime numbers, time adverbials, Napoleon, Goalball, German food and Easter in Australia linked with rabbits and bilbies. We hope you enjoyed it.

The next homework will be due in on Friday 23rd May.
